Health Watch!

Conservative Councillor Janet
Bowen-Hitchings is our spokesperson
for Health. While the council are not
directly responsible for the Health services
we do have a community leadership role
as well partner many long term care
services with Kingston Primary Care Trust
(PCT).

The PCT has hit the head lines about their £22 million debts and that news has forced Kingston Hospital to postpone its own transformation in to a foundation Hospital and thus preserve its status as the key provider of critical care in SW London.

The PCT worsening position saw the departure of their Chief Executive and we still await positive news of Surbiton Hospital. We also now have growing concerns that Tolworth Hospital is also under threat.



Nick Kilby asks "Where are the millions the Labour party has 'invested' in the Health service? Then Consultants fees on how to save money? Or wasted on senior management that fail to deliver real improvements to us the residents of Surbiton Hill and Kingston as a whole."

Janet says "I'm leading our Conservative groups focus on making sure that the PCT seeks more funding and does not just slash services. We still remain hopeful for the future for Surbiton Hospital but it could well be 2010 before we see it in a new form."







Social Service

Conservative Councillors are paying particular attention to the Council's current consultation over proposed amendments to the eligibility for adult social care services. Their intended dissolving of two tiers of services would, according to the Council, be to improve their effectiveness and develop preventative services.

Kingston is the only London Borough that currently offers all four tiers of risk and need. The proposals under consultation are to cut Council funding to those adults who require low to moderate care and replace that service with a self-help preventative service.

The **Conservative Group** are actively seeking to ensure that everyone who benefits currently from the Councils care services has their say. The Borough has, for many years, offered a full and comprehensive service and we now fear it is under threat in the forthcoming budget. Conservative Councillors are taking a keen interest in this consultation, and the Council is seeking views of all interested parties.

Lib Dem administration is looking at how they can cut £20 million from the budgets over the next five years. Social Services accounts for 40% of the total budget and will come under increasing pressure. Without everyone speaking up now, vital services may be cut without the Lib Dems appreciating the effects of their actions.

Spokesperson for Adult Services said: "To keep the council tax down the Lib Dems have hard choices to make, our fear is that the venerable members of our community will be asked to suffer instead of Lib Dem pet projects being cut or stopped! This consultation process is the calm before the storm!"

Conservative Councillors support the concerns expressed at the **Lib Dems planned cuts** of the Housing Ranger service and the Dog Warden service.

Clirs Nick Kilby and Clir Paul Johnston, are united in the view that the Council is now looking very exposed following the dramatic increase in Housing subsidy paid to the Labour Government. This will next year equate to 28p FOR EVERY £1 of rent paid by our tenants and we may now start to see the Housing Service buckling under this financial pressure with little or no leadership from the Lib

Conservative Cllrs welcomed the administrations recent climb down on keeping the Dog Warden.

But we also emphasize that the Rangers play a vital role in the community. The Council would be foolish to lose this important role from the Borough.

School Lane may get urgent repairs to staircases and windows and but decent homes work has been stopped and new kitchens and bathrooms are on hold. Nearly £6 million will be grabbed by central Government from tenants rents. That now means that since stock transfer £11 million has been taken where as if the vote had been successful every tenant would be benefiting from a significant investment.
