Buddha Images - gala night

Wednesday, June 2, 7-9pm (exhibition runs from Wednesday, June 2 to Wednesday, June 30)

A gala evening to usher in an exhibition of photography on the Far East, will be held at the cornerHOUSE on Wednesday, June 2.

The event is being hosted by Mark White and Mary Harwood whose exhibition, Buddha Images, records their numerous trips to China and Hong Kong.

This is the second time the couple, who have a background in practical and commercial photography, have shown their work at the arts centre in Douglas Road, Surbiton. The exhibition records the rich and varied culture the Far East has to offer, as well as bringing together studies of iconic Buddha statues shot in a contemporary manner.

"We are delighted to be given another opportunity to share our love of the Orient and photography with like-minded people," said Mark. "Our gala evening last year was great fun. It was a joy to talk to people who had either travelled to the same areas - or were planning to - or were also keen photographers interested in chatting about different techniques."

Mark said their aim was to capture and share the beauty of the East.

"As a couple, we have travelled many times to the Far East and accumulated a large and diverse library of travel photographs," said Mark. "These range from peaceful landscape and temple images, to photos capturing the unique bustle and friendly rush of busy cities. "Our trips inspired Mary to create a number of photographic studies recalling the Eastern atmosphere."

Mark said that this year there would be a range of items for sale, including canvases and affordable mounted photos ready for framing. Prices range from £15 to £100 for already framed work.

The gala evening on Wednesday, June 2, starts at 7.30pm. All are welcome. Mark and Mary will be there, happy to discuss their work.

Summer Vocal Showcase

Songs from recent productions on Broadway will be performed in a Summer Vocal Showcase at the cornerHOUSE in June.

Singing tutor and musical director Keesha Mclean will be showcasing the talents of her students during the production, which also draws on the work of up-and-coming musical theatre composers and lyricists.

Mclean, who has directed shows at the Surbiton arts centre before, including this year's A-Tisket, A-Tasket, a stunning tribute to America's jazz divas, and last year's acclaimed Century of Musicals, said: "Giving a student the opportunity to perform in a professional environment in front of a warm and supportive audience is not only a valuable experience for those who wish to pursue the performing arts further, but is also a wonderful journey to build their confidence and character."

Some of Mclean's students who will be taking part have performed in the West End as well as at the Rose Theatre in Kingston and in previous productions at the cornerHOUSE.

The Summer Vocal Showcase includes songs from the musical 13, In The Heights, The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, Edges and Spring Awakening, as well as favourites from Oklahoma, West Side Story, Funny Girl, The Scarlet Pimpernel, Spamalot and Wicked.

The show, at the Douglas Road arts centre, is divided into two parts - one for Mclean's senior students, the other for her junior pupils.

Seniors perform on Friday, June 25 and Saturday, June 26 at 7.45pm, and juniors perform on the Saturday matinee at 2pm.
