

Queen's Diamond Jubilee Fields Challenge

The Surbiton Neighbourhood Committee has nominated Alexandra Recreation Ground and Claremont Gardens to be entered into the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Fields Challenge. This aims to permanently protect 2012 playing fields and other nominated recreation spaces across the UK, ensuring access to outdoor sport, play and recreation - both now and for future generations. The Challenge will give everyone the opportunity to participate in creating their own legacy through public votes. Up to five sites will be chosen across the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames, and these will be put to the public vote in May. The two areas receiving the highest votes will



become the Queen Elizabeth II Fields in their area.

Surbiton Town Centre Improvement Strategy - Your Surbiton, Your Views!

The first phase of public consultation on medium-term improvements for the Town Centre will take place between 23 April and 14 May. The second phase will follow when more funding becomes available. The proposed improvements include:

Phase I (Consultation 23 April – 14 May 2011)

- Reconstruction of the carriageway of Victoria Road between the roundabout at the station and St Andrew's Road
- Widening of the pavement on the station side of Victoria Road to provide better quality space for pedestrians to walk and stand, particularly by the bus stop near the station
- Changes to the parking layout and times of restrictions in Victoria Road between the station and the Sainsbury's car park access road to provide for deliveries
- Widening of the Brighton Road on the approach to the traffic signals at Balaclava Road


Phase 2 (consultation at future date when funding becomes available)

- Widening of pavements where possible to provide better quality space for pedestrians
- New pavement surfacing to improve the quality of the area
- New street lighting as the existing lamp columns need to be replaced
- De-cluttering of pavements, including a review of street furniture
- Additional street trees where possible

Planning Permission for Surbiton Hospital Site Redevelopment



The health facility is expected to be open 12 hours a day, 7 days a week providing services from up to eight existing local GP practices and other care providers - including diagnostic and outpatient services. Patients will be able to retain their relationship with their own GP as well as having access to more services and appointments, including walk-in urgent care.

The new school will provide up to 60 primary places per year, plus 26 nursery school places. It forms part of Kingston Council's Primary School Expansion Programme and will meet the growing need for school places in Surbiton.

It is intended that both buildings will offer extended community usage including access to information about local services, clubs and activities, as well as the opportunity for the public make use of rooms and facilities during certain times of the day.

The current programme for development is:

- Summer 2011 building works to start on site
- September 2012 school opens for nursery, reception class and Year I pupils
- Spring 2013 new health facilities to open

Stay Safe Indoors with Free Home Fire Safety Visits

London Fire Brigade wants you to be safe and is carrying out free home fire safety visits for residents in the Royal Borough of Kingston and the other boroughs in London.

London Fire Brigade personnel will arrange to visit you in your home and along with providing and fitting smoke alarms free of charge, they will discuss any home fire safety issues or questions you may have and go through planning an escape route for you and your family in the event of a fire.

Fires in the home are the main cause of fire deaths. Getting a smoke alarm, regularly testing and maintaining it, as well as planning your escape route in the event of a fire, can dramatically decrease the risk of death or serious injury.

This is a scheme whereby offenders undertake cleanups and other tasks as part of their community service jointly managed by the Probation Service, Safer Neighbourhood Teams and RBK.

May 2011 Referendum

On 5 May this year, the Government is holding a referendum about changing the voting system used at general elections. The question being put to the public is "At present, the UK uses the 'first past the post' system to elect MPs to the House of Commons. Should the 'alternative vote' system be used instead?"

With the current system, the candidate who gets the most votes in their constituency is elected as the MP. The new system involves voters ranking candidates in order of preference and then reallocating those with the fewest votes, until one candidate has more than 50% of the votes. Poll cards are being sent out late March - make sure your voice is heard by voting on Thursday 5 May. Don't forget to ensure you are registered before the cut-off date, 14 April.
